



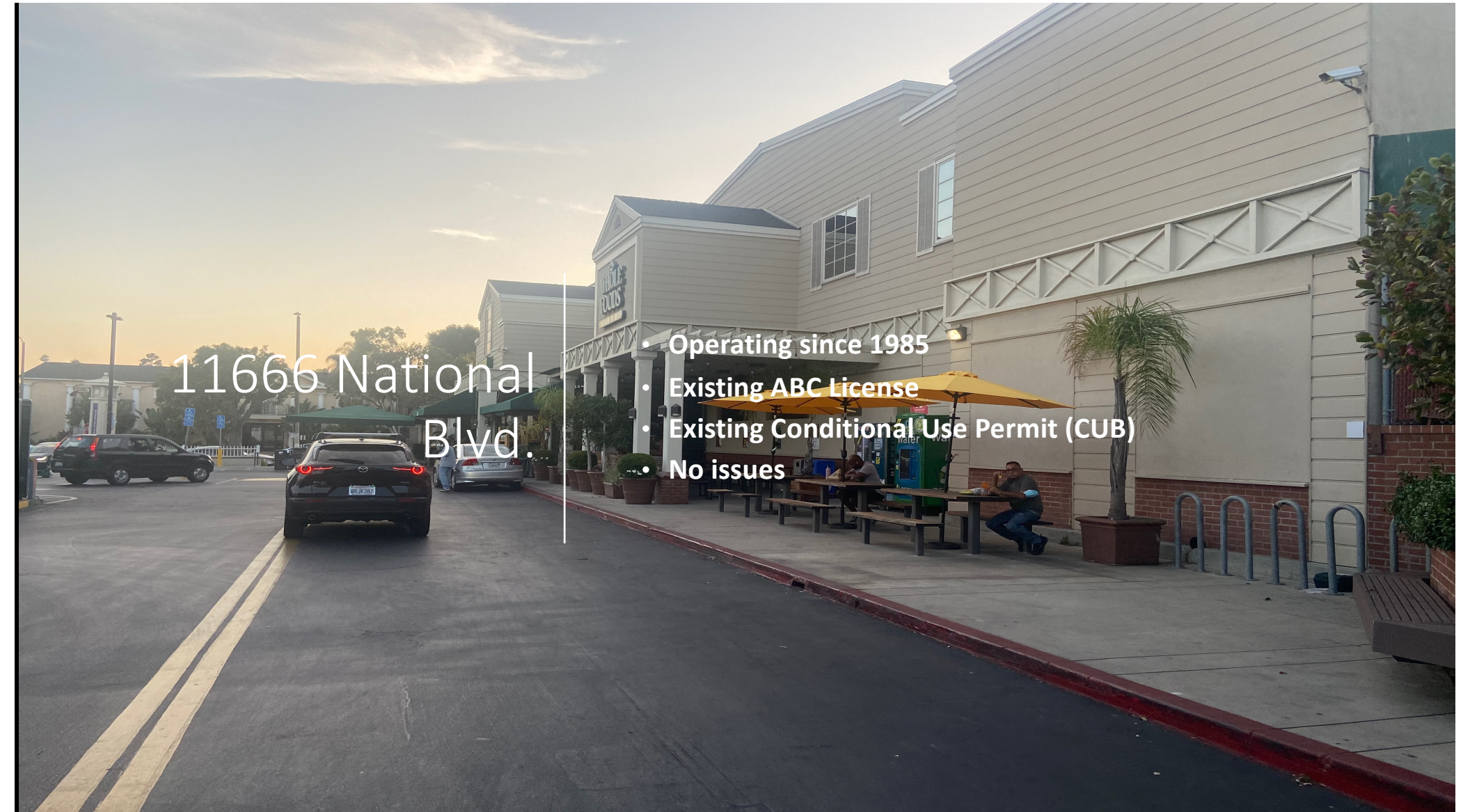

The Los Angeles Police Department, Pacific Area Vice Unit, has reviewed the proposed plan for Case No. ZA-96-0405-(PAB) (PA1), for the development known as Whole Foods Market, located at 11666 National Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90064. The applicant currently holds a Type 20 ABC license (off sale beer and wine), as well as a Type 86 (instructional tasting license). The applicant is requesting to allow the for a Type 21 ABC license (off sale general liquor license) and ancillary instructional tastings. The applicant also requests to modify the hours of operation and delivery. The applicant currently operates from 7 A.M. to 10 P.M., daily, with deliveries from 7 A.M. to 8 P.M., Monday through Friday, and 10 A.M. to 4 P.M., Saturday and Sunday. The applicant requests to operate from 6 A.M. to 12 A.M., daily, with loading and delivery hours from 7 A.M. to 9 P.M., daily.

The applicant has a history of responsible business practices related to its ABC licensing. It is the opinion of the Los Angeles Police Department that the changes the applicant is seeking would not have a negative impact on the surrounding community safety or burden on law enforcement.

The Los Angeles Police Department is not opposed to the conditional changes asked for by the applicant. However, this location is seeking several major modifications and the Los Angeles Police Department would ask that the following minimum conditions be placed on the establishment:

1. Video surveillance system installed and maintained by the applicant and accessible to the Department for criminal investigations.
2. All employees charged with the dispensing and/or service of alcoholic beverages attend the Department STAR training.

3. Maintain good standing with no ABC related violations for a period of two years before being allowed to apply for a modification or upgrade of their permit.
4. No signs shall be permitted which are visible from the outside which advertise the availability of alcohol consumption on the premises.
