JANUARY CRIMES AT A GLANCE

Agg Assault - On 1/02/25, a named suspect struck victim's face and cut his hair. Suspect is victim's girlfriend's ex-boyfriend. Agg Assault - On 1/07/25, an ex-boyfriend strangled & kicked his ex-girlfriend.

Street Robbery – On 1/08/25, three suspects followed a victim to his National Bl & Sawtelle Bl business and took his cash deposit at gunpoint. Suspect's vehicle was impounded downtown that night.

Acquaintance Rape- On 1/14/25, an ex-boyfriend raped his ex-girlfriend after he dropped her property off at her apartment. Acquaintance Rape- On 1/30/25, a teacher is being investigated for using fingers to penetrate a child at a school.

There were only eleven reported burglaries for January 2025. Most were residential. Aside from typical residential burglaries, two trends also occurring in this, and the surrounding areas are 1) empty residences under construction where appliances and small items such as door handles & knobs are being taken just prior to completion and 2) houses with fumigation tents being burglarized. In 2024, this area averaged 18 burglaries per month. Also, in January 2023, there were 22 burglaries and January 2024, there were 31; so with the 11 in January 2025, Mar Vista is trending in the right direction.

The table below shows the January crime numbers for the past three years, so you can compare how this past month (in yellow) was compared to the two prior years.
