IN CONFORMITY WITH THE OCTOBER 6, 2023 ENACTMENT OF CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL 411 (PORTANTINO) AND LA CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL ON NOVEMBER 1, 2023 THE MAR VISTA COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING WILL BE CONDUCTED VIRTUALLY.

Every person wishing to address the Board must dia 1669 900-6333, and enter 846 6660 9891 and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to 1 minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.

(i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph, to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.

- (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.
- (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to one minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.



City Clerk is currently allowing neighborhood councils to contribute to organizations for fire relief as a community outreach, (contribution form or invoice needed), Zoom updates - renew Zoom license for 2025-2026 year. Requires board approval renewal period is through April 1. Website updates - improvement to website's front page, google drive folder for neighborhood councils. Annual Budget 101 workshop is available on thursday March 6 from 6-730pm; it is virtual.

Ambar Quintanilla - Know your rights events, unjust detainments by ICE let office know; passed 2.5 billion for fire relief. Events: constituent service day by South LA.Also considering doing in Mar Vista Gardens. Economic Summit event - community based organizations that focus on AI, Cannabis, for panel discussion for making these three organizations more equitable.

Traci Park - Discussion - Cardina recovery of fires; Gateway Mural update - Department of Cultural Affairs, Cartrans and CD 5. North side of Venice Blvd. permission to use the wall. We can move forward not with requests for proposals. cd.11.lacity.org. Homelessness - substantial strides have been made. Over 2 years, they have gotten over 600 people in housing. Many of the people who remain on the streets are not well enough to say yes, or don't want to go. We don't have legal tools yet. Continuing to advance legislation. LAPD and the Circle Team are working together using 41.18. Expanding Careplus operations to do robust cleanup. RV's and vehicle dwelling - similar to 41.18, looking for safe parking. Westcoast Care focuses on family reunifications. Illegal vehicle repair on Grandview has relocated one vehicle. Fire Department - half firefighters than we need. Fire hydrants - immediate assessment and repair in the city of Los Angeles. Sunday-pancake breakfast for Fire Department 62. March 13, 6-7-30 - open call Town Hall. registration is forthcoming. March 1 - tax prep and resource fair in Mar Vista Gardens, free.
